

THE NEXT BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING


The next Board meeting is scheduled on Thursday June 14th at 7:00pm.

The agenda for all board meetings is posted in advance at the entrance to the Clubhouse. Monthly meetings are open to all homeowners. The 15-20 minute Open Forum session at the start is an opportunity to have any issues heard by the board, association manager, and others present, and to ask questions about any projects or decisions addressed by the board.

Following Open Forum, the meeting is limited to those issues posted on the agenda. Homeowners are welcome and encouraged to stay and observe, but this part of the meeting is closed to owner participation. Minutes of all meetings are posted on the website after they have been approved at the next board meeting.

MAY NEWS

'Tis turtle season again! As our hopeful little mamas leave the lake and wander out in a search of places to lay eggs, keep a look out for little grey lumps on the perimeter road, and slow down so you do not run them over!



Please do pick the turtles up by their shells (at arms length initially, as they pee quite copiously when frightened) and return them to the lake.

Asphalt re-sealing of Vineyard Lane and the garage access courtyards is scheduled for July/August. At that time vehicles parked in perimeter parking spaces will need to be moved at fairly short notice. If you are planning a vacation during this timeframe, please plan ahead and make sure you park your vehicle safely in your garage.

Typically a few days notice will be given, as sections of the pavement are re-sealed. Cars that are not moved when the notices are posted will be towed at their owner's expense.

Dogs must be leashed at all times. Please observe this important rule (Section 10.04 (b) in the CCRs) without exception. Owners who blatantly ignore this rule will be called for hearings in front of the Board and fined.

There were two recent mailbox break-ins at locations near the front gate in the 200s and 900s. Unfortunately the HOA has no legal right to represent or intercede on behalf of Vineyards residents – the USPS owns 'our' mailboxes and is responsible for their replacement, repair and maintenance.

You may find it useful to enroll in the free USPS Informed Delivery service, which lets you preview letter mail and track packages.

BBQ SAFETY

During grill season please stay safe and aware of some fire safety concerns. No fire pits or open flame BBQ grills are allowed on the balconies or patios – if in doubt call Bill Oldfield and check before you fire-up or purchase a new grill.

There is a large communal gas BBQ next to the Big Pool for delicious open flame grilling, and a propane grill at the Clubhouse Pool. All residents may use these, but please be prepared to share the space, and to clean the grates and area around the BBQs after each use – you do not want your greasy messes to attract roaches or ants!

POOL SEASON

Please observe poolside courtesies, and Vineyards Operating Rules.

- + Entry to the pool area is by residents' key fob
- + Do not open the gate or lend your key fob to others
- + Children must be accompanied and supervised by an adult
- + Residents must accompany their guests (max 4 per unit) at all times
- + Loungers, tables and BBQ facilities cannot be reserved
- + Diapers including swim diapers are not permitted
- + Be considerate if you swim laps during quiet hours & close the gate softly
- + No glassware or bottles should be brought into the pool area please use acrylic glasses or cans
- + No diving, running, screaming, loud music or any behavior that causes annoyance to other pool users or neighbors
- + Non-resident owners are not allowed to use the pools or other common area amenities

Since the Big Pool has no bathroom, families are strongly encouraged to use the Clubhouse Pool with its adjacent toilet, shower & changing facilities.

SIGN UP WITH THE SANTA CLARA COUNTY EMERGENCY ALERT SYSTEM

AlertSCC is a free, easy, and confidential way for anyone who lives or works in Santa Clara County to get emergency warnings sent directly to their cell phone, mobile device, email, or landline. AlertSCC can reach you wherever you are to provide information and instructions in a variety of emergency situations, which may include the following:

- Flooding, wildfires and subsequent evacuations
- Public safety incidents, including crimes, that immediately affect your neighborhood
- Post-disaster information about shelters, transportation, or supplies

AlertSCC allows authorized personnel from the City of Saratoga and Santa Clara County to send messages simultaneously to phone numbers included in the E-911 database, White Pages, Yellow Pages, and to every phone number, SMS address, and email address you sign up using text messages, voice messages, and emails. Messages reach TYY receiving devices for deaf and hard of hearing.



The alert is instantly delivered to your home or business telephone, wireless devices and e-mail account.

AlertSCC communications are dependent upon external providers such as your wireless carrier or e-mail delivery service. This emergency alert system is designed to supplement, rather than replace, other communication methods used by emergency responders, both in person and through the use of other media. Television, radio and County/city websites will still continue to broadcast important announcements as before.

VINEYARDS RECIPES FOR MAY

Years ago there was a community cocktail night every Friday at the Clubhouse! For your drinking pleasure here are three recipes published in the Grapevine in the 1970's and three favorites from modern day mixologist Jan Scicinski. As Jan and I move to the East Coast and bid the Vineyards farewell, we raise our glasses to good friends and neighbors! Cheers! Na zdrowie! May we meet again! ESPRESSO MARTINI

- 4 oz vodka
- 2 oz St. George's NOLA coffee liquer
- 2 x 1.5oz shots of espresso coffee
- 4 cardamom pods
- 2 dashes Dutch's Colonial Bitters
- 1. Put the vodka and coffee liqueur into a Boston shaker.
- 2. Add cardamom pods and crush gently with a muddler.
- 3. Add the rest of the ingredients and shake for 1 minute.
- 4. Strain and serve.

PISCO SOUR

1 oz lime juice

1 egg white*

1 ½ oz Pisco

3/4 oz Simple Syrup

3 drops of Angostura bitters



FRESH CALIFORNIA STRAWBERRY DAIQUIRI

In a blender mix 5 fresh strawberrries, 1 tablesppoon lime juice, 1 teaspoon sugar, jigger of Bacardi light rum and ½ cup crushed ice. Blend until thick. Serve in chilled cocktail glass. (For year round, use frozen strawberries).

- 1. Combine the Pisco, simple syrup, and lime juice in a Boston Shaker
- 2. Add egg whites (* pasteurized carton egg whites work well) no ice yet!!!
- 3. Shake without ice for about 20 seconds, the add ice and shake again
- 4. Serve in old-fashioned or margarita glasses, distributing the foam evenly
- 5. Decorate the foam with three drops of bitters

CUCUMBER AND LIME GIN FIZZ

4 slices peeled cucumber

2 unpeeled slices for garnish

12 fresh mint leaves

4 sprigs fresh cilantro

4 tsps turbinado sugar

2 oz fresh lime juice

3 – 4 oz club soda per glass

4 oz cucumber infused gin (such as Hendrick's)



Northern Lights
11/2 oz. Yukon Jack

Pour Yukon Jack over ice


in a tall glass. Add equal parts

Cranberry Juice

cranberry juice and orange juice. Stir.

Orange Juice


- 1. Place the peeled cucumber slices, mint, cilantro, and sugar in a Boston shaker and muddle.
- 2. Add the lime juice and gin
- 3. Fill the shaker with ice and shake vigorously for 1 2 minutes (this seems long but it's essential)
- 4. Fill a cocktail glass with fresh ice
- 5. Strain the drink into the glass, top with club soda and garnish with a cucumber slice
