# Garbage & Recycling

Additional garbage costs can be avoided If everyone flattens cardboard boxes before putting them into recycle containers and no one abandons any items on the ground. The garbage collection vehicles will not pick any items from the ground, and if their access is blocked may refuse to take the dumpster out of the enclosure. This is an ongoing problem, especially around dumpster number 3. No items of unwanted furniture or household goods should NEVER be abandoned in or next to the dumpster enclosures.

Please make sure you check your statements. Occasionally an issue with a payment will occur and a late fee will be assessed. Unless you check your statement you will not know and get behind on your dues.

# Wood Burning

The main adverse health impact of burning wood, manufactured fireplace logs or similar products in common fireplaces is wood smoke, which contains harmful substances. On its website, Bay Area Air Quality Management District states: "Small particles and toxic chemicals from wood smoke can cause serious health problems, especially in children, older adults, and those with heart or respiratory problems." Additionally, California Air Resources Board in its *Wood Burning Handbook* states: "...Manufactured fireplace logs, for instance, are not recommended for burning because they produce toxic fumes..."

Also, since fireplaces exhaust indoor air up the chimney during such burning, furnaces can run longer in order to heat and replace such exhausted air.

In summary, one of the best ways to help protect you and/or your neighbors from the adverse effects of toxic air pollutants and potentially save money, is to avoid wood burning.
