# **Garbage & Recycling**

Additional garbage costs can be avoided If everyone flattens cardboard boxes before putting them into recycle containers and no one abandons any items on the ground. The garbage collection vehicles will not pick any items from the ground, and if their access is blocked may refuse to take the dumpster out of the enclosure. This is an ongoing problem, especially around dumpster number 3. No items of unwanted furniture or household goods should EVER be abandoned in or next to the dumpster enclosures. If a dumpster is full please hold onto your recyclables until the bin has been emptied.

## Fine Hearing for Garbage or Recycling Violations

Numerous notices have been posted and sent about the proper disposal of trash and recycling at the Vineyards of Saratoga. Warning letters for violations for improper disposal of either will no longer be sent and a fine hearing will be called.

# THE NEXT BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

The Board meeting will be held on Thursday April 14, 2022 at 7:00 PM. Details about attending the meeting will be post in the community at least four days prior to the meeting. You can also email the Association Manager for further details on attending the meeting. The 15-20 minute Open Forum session at the start is an opportunity to have any issues heard by the board, association manager, and others present, and to ask questions about any projects or decisions addressed by the board. Following Open Forum, the meeting is limited to those issues posted on the agenda. Homeowners are welcome and encouraged to stay and observe, but this part of the meeting is closed to owner participation. Minutes of all meetings are posted on the website after they have been approved at the next board meeting.

# Is that the right bin?

Please make sure to put the right things in the right bin. The white dumpsters and blue bins are for recycling. The green dumpsters are for garbage.

#### A lot of our citrus fruit will soon be ripe!

It's that time of the year but please remember, one of our Operating Rules is:

4.2 Flowers or fruit in the common area shall only be picked if the Resident takes care not to damage the plant and leaves adequate blossoms and fruit for other Residents to enjoy.

This means you could possibly be fined for picking more than a few. And we now have cameras on some of the trees!

The fruit will last on the tree quite a long time for all to enjoy over time. If you need more than a couple, please purchase them at the store.

A simple tug or twist will release a ripe piece of fruit. If you have to cut or break the branch to obtain the fruit, it's not ripe yet. The Meyer lemons will turn a darker yellow/orange before they are ready to be picked. A lot of our limes have turned yellow – but they are still limes. If you are unsure what kind of tree it is. The trees have a silver tag low on the tree identifying what kind of tree it is.

#### **New NextDoor Groups**

Details about joining the new NextDoor groups announced a coupled months ago has been added to the side bar of the first page of the newsletter. This information will remain in the newsletter moving forward. The introduction of the two private groups, where we can invite and remove people, will be removed.
